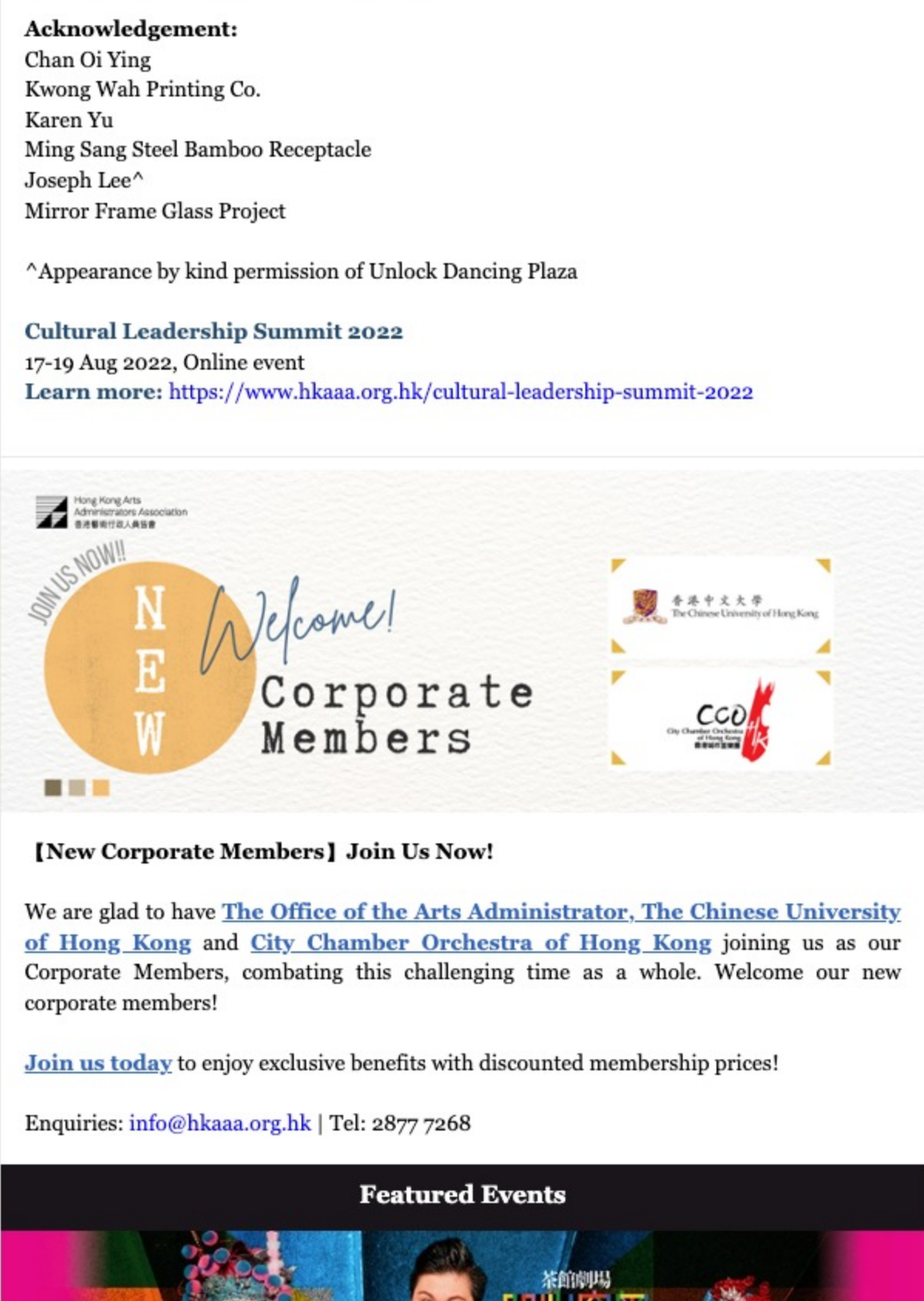

Traditional craftsmanship used to be one of the most prosperous industries in Hong Kong. These long-established brands encapsulated the changes of time. This year, Cultural Leadership Summit brings together a collaboration of local young artists and dwindling traditional crafts shops, with an aim to showcase Hong Kong's local arts and cultures on an international level.

3 local young artists of different arts disciplines, **Chan Oi Ying** (Chinese Calligraphy Artist), **Karen Yu** (Percussionist and Sound Artist) and **Joseph Lee** (Choreographer and Dancer), collaborate with 3 **Hong Kong traditional crafts shops** to uncover the traditional handicrafts of the movable-type printing, bamboo steamers and glass works.

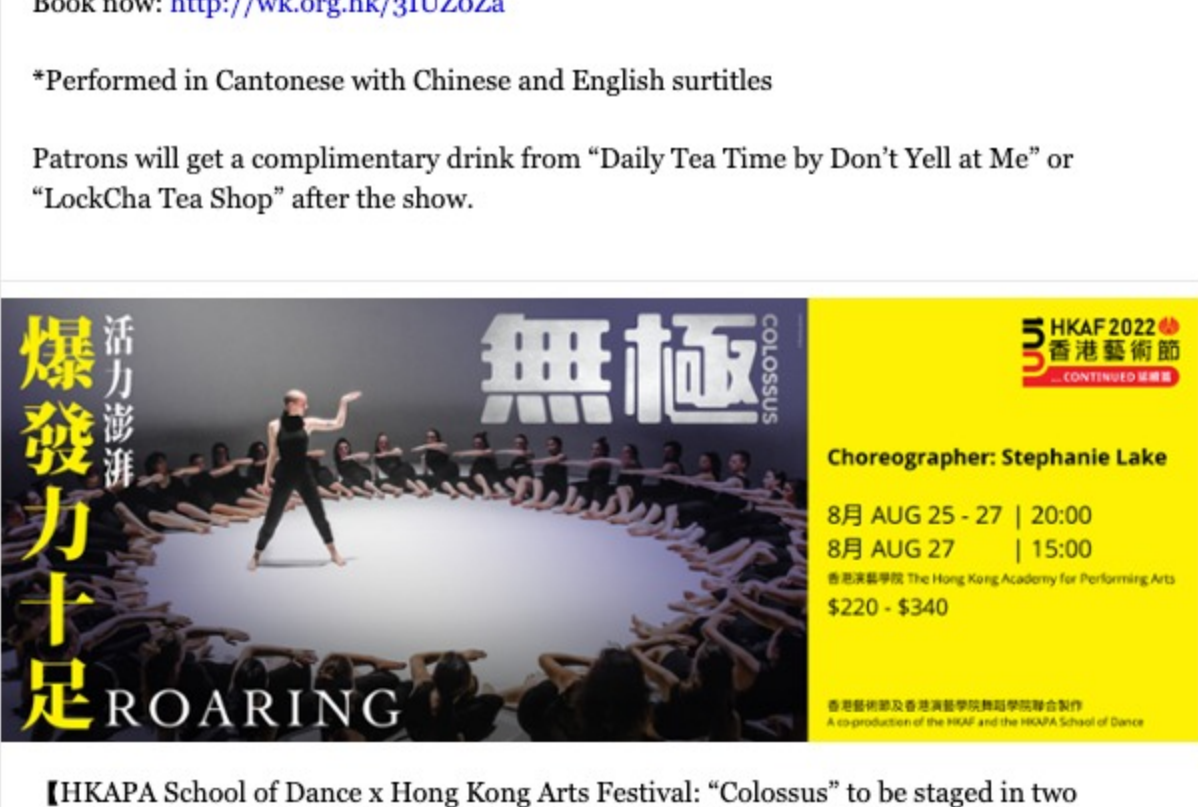

Tickets are now on sale for "Magic Tea House"

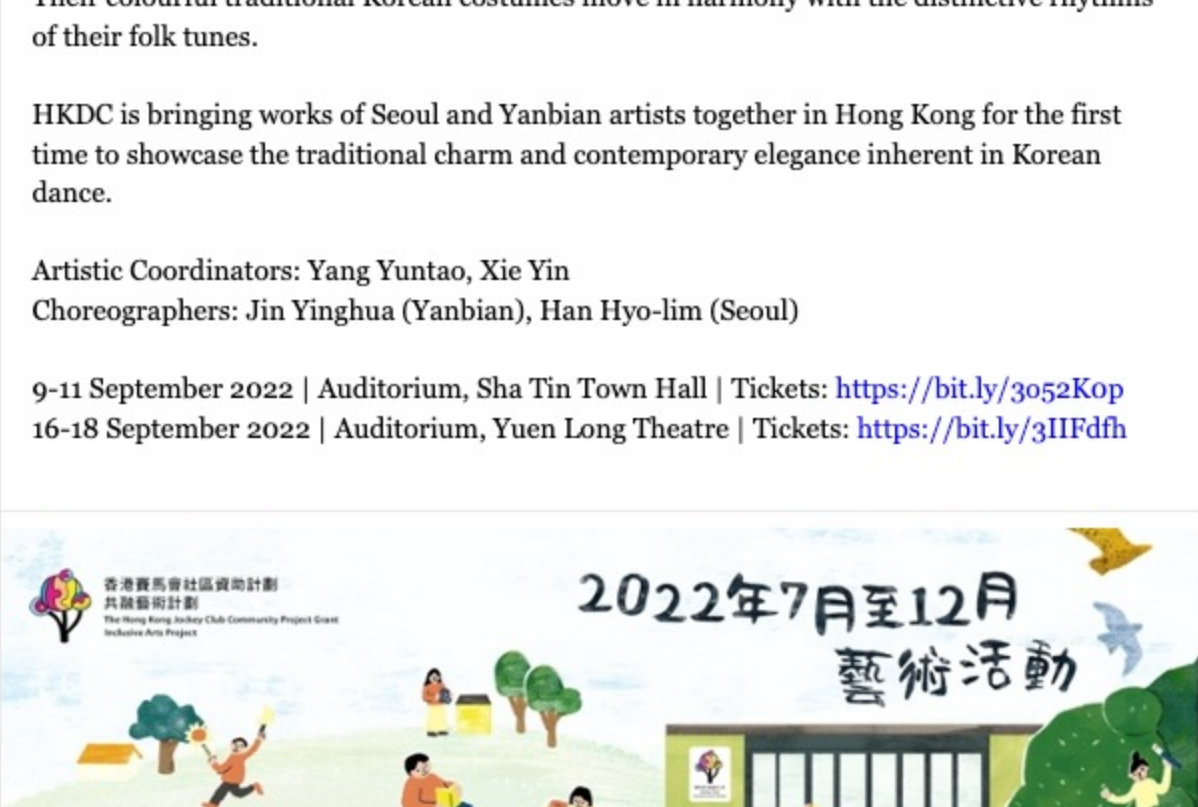

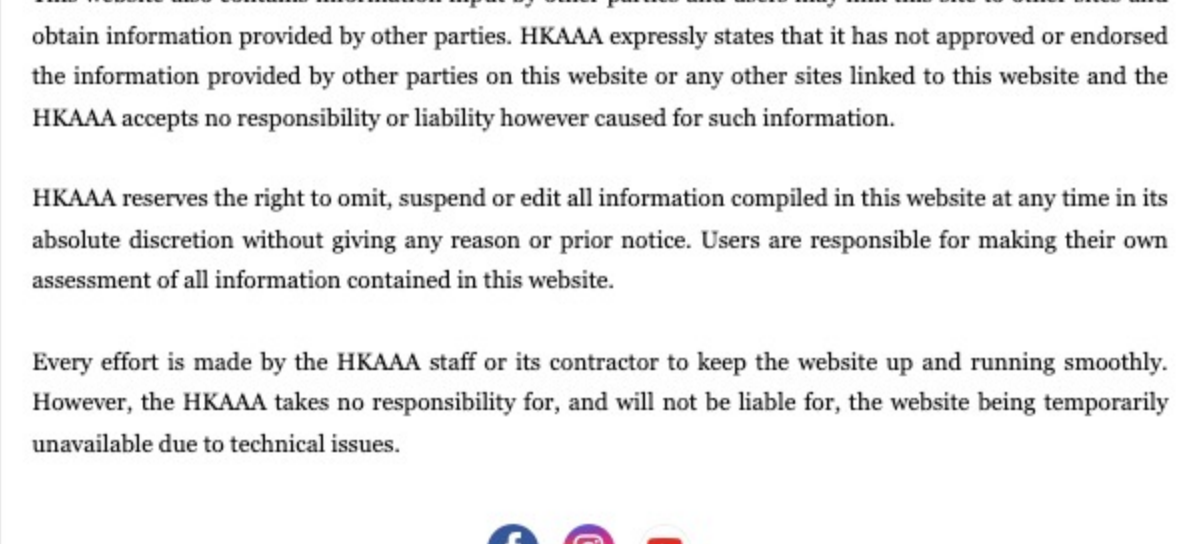
Hong Kong Dance Company proudly presents 2022/23 Season Opening Programme Anthology of Korean Folk Dance Myth of the Dancing Durumi
